1 RINKO PARK

Enjoy the great view of Port of Yokohama from the largest green in Minatomirai 21. The spacious lawn and the curved waterfront make the park an ideal spot to relax and feel the breeze.



5 RED BRICK WAREHOUSE

The warehouse was built during the early decades of the 20th century. It was restored and opened in 2002 as a cultural and commercial complex to accommodate various seasonal events. It is one of the major tourist attractions in Yokohama.



2 PUKARISANBASHI PIER

The pier opened in 1991 as the first floating terminal in Japan for regular liners and excursion boats that cruise around Port of Yokohama. The white tower with a green roof is an icon of the port.



6 ZOU NO HANA PARK

(Elephant's Nose Park) The wharf that was built in 1859 along with the opening of the port of Yokohama was remade into a park in 2009. It was named after the shape of the breakwater that resembles an elephant's nose.



3 MEGAMIBASHI BRIDGE

(Goddess Bridge) The pedestrian bridge connects Central and Shinko districts of Minatomirai 21. Its name comes from the statue of goddess placed at the top of InterContinental Yokohama Grand.



7 OSANBASHI

Since the pier was first built in the late 1900s, it has been reconstructed multiple times before the current 7th international terminal was completed in 2002. The wooden-deck rooftop with lawn spaces is a popular spot to enjoy the port view.



4 HAMMERHEAD CRANE

The crane is a large-size cargo-handling machine made in Britain more than 100 years ago. Yokohama Hammerhead, a complex facility consisting of a passenger ship terminal, hotel and commercial facilities, opened in 2019.



8 YAMASHITA PARK

The park with a port view representing Yokohama was made in 1930 by filling the sea with the rubble from the Great Kanto Earthquake. NYK Hikawa Maru, the ship used for the Seattle line during and after the war, is preserved here.

BAYWALK YOKOHAMA

Along the waterfront path overlooking the Port of Yokohama is a scenic walking & jogging course with a one-way distance of around 5km (6km when including a loop around Yamashita Park). What makes this special is its unique route where you feel the perfect amount of sea breeze while it takes you through sightseeing destinations in the Yokohama Inner Harbor Area boasting some of the world's most splendid views. The beautiful landscape of the port is not only magnificent during the day but also provides a setting for a stunning night view after dark. It is worth the visit without a doubt.

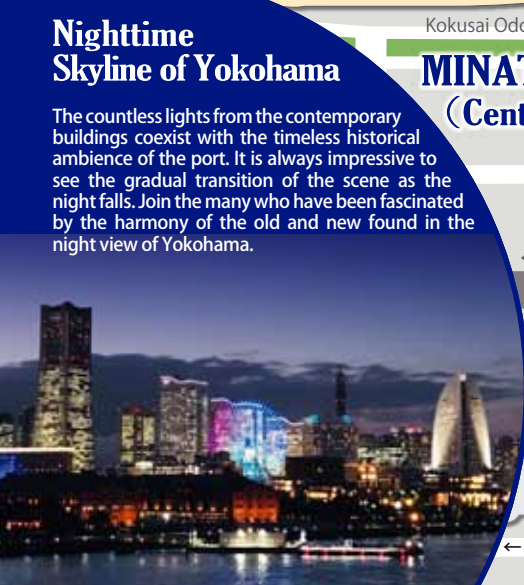
