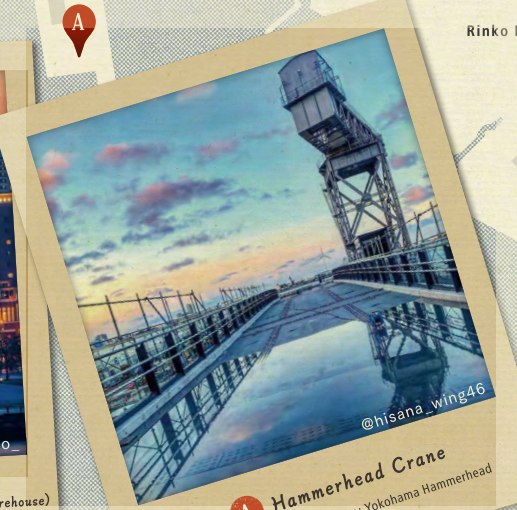

Sail Training Ship Nippon Maru & Yokohama Port Museum



Take a tour of the traditional Sail Training Ship Nippon Maru at Nippon Maru Memorial Park. The Yokohama Port Museum has been renovated with new areas including the introduction of a VR system that allows visitors to experience the port dynamically, an exhibition with videos displaying the arrival of Commodore Perry's ships and negotiations for the opening of the port, and the development of the port by continuous reclamation and port construction.



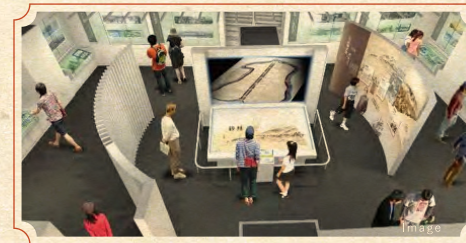
The opening of the port changed a small fishing village

Japan was closed off from the world for 220 years during the Edo period, but in 1853, ships led by Commodore Perry appeared, urging the country to open up. The next year, the Edo Shogunate signed the Japan-US Treaty of Amity, promising to open up Japan. Once a small fishing village, Yokohama transformed into a quaint city with a new western culture after the opening of the port in 1859.

From the reconstruction after the quake and war to now

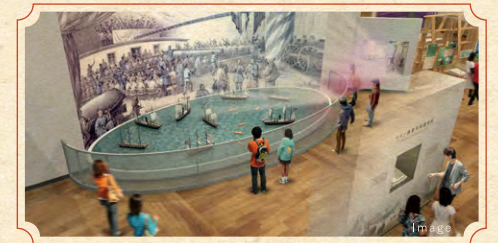
After the opening of the port, Yokohama developed as a window for trade and civilization to flourish with the completion of Osanbashi and Shinko Pier. The city was later hit hard by the Great Kanto Earthquake in 1923 and the air raids on Yokohama in 1945, but due to the unrelenting efforts of its citizens, it was rebuilt each time and became the second most populous city in Japan.

The history of Yokohama's land reclamation and port construction

Introducing the changes in land reclamation and port construction from Edo period to the present with videos, actual objects, graphics and models.



Video of the arrival of Commodore Perry and the opening of the port.

The negotiation scenes from the arrival of "Black Ships" to the opening of the port are presented with models and projection mapping to appeal to the eyes of visitors.

There are about 12 Sail-unfurling days a year.

Sail Training Ship Nippon Maru

The Sail Training Ship Nippon Maru was nicknamed the "Swan of the Pacific" for its beautiful shape.

The Sail Training Ship Nippon Maru was built in 1930 to train sailors. By the time it was retired, the ship had sailed a total of 1.83 million km, circled the globe 45 times and trained 11,500 sailors. The engine has been in operation for 54 years and 2 months, the longest in the world for a marine engine, and is listed in the Guinness Book of World Records. The dock where the sail training ship Nippon Maru is preserved is a Nationally Designated Important Cultural Property, and you can see it without water in the Dockyard Garden at the foot of the Landmark Tower.

5 Zou-no-hana Park

Designated as a place to open under the Japan-US Treaty of Amity and Commerce in 1858, it became the first wharf in Yokohama. The shape of the breakwater resembles an elephant's nose. The "Zou-no-hana Breakwater" has been restored. The "Zou-no-hana Terrace", is a rest house that combines an art space with the "Zou-no-hana Cafe".

6 Nihon-Odori

This is the first Western-style street in Japan, built after the Great Yokohama Fire of 1866 to serve as a firebreak between the Japanese and foreign settlement. Visitors can enjoy the beautiful rows of ginkgo trees and historical buildings built in the early 20th century.

Yokohama Chinatown

After the Treaty of Amity and Commerce, many Chinese began living in the settlement. In 1899, the settlement system was abolished, but the number of overseas Chinese living around the old settlement gradually increased. After the Great Kanto Earthquake, the area was again hit hard by the war, but it later regained its prosperity. Today, it is one of the largest Chinatowns in the world.

COLUMN



Bashamichi

Bashamichi is the road that horse-drawn carriages used to pass through. After the Great Yokohama Fire, the street was widened to 18 meters at the request of foreign residents and became the main street. At the end of the Edo period, a regular horse-drawn carriage service was provided to and from Edo, and a two-horse carriage service was started. In 1872, the first full-scale use of gas lamps in Japan began here.

Cruise ships from all over the world call into this international terminal. Visitors can enjoy the view of Minato Mirai 21 and the Yokohama Three Towers from the rooftop plaza. It is nicknamed "Whale's Back" because it looks like the back of a whale floating on the water.

4 Aka-Renga Soko (Yokohama Red Brick Warehouse)

Aka-Renga Soko was built in the early 1900s as a storage warehouse. Now it is used as a gallery space, restaurants and stores, and is visited by many people as a popular tourist spot. At night, it is lit up, creating a fantastic atmosphere.

(The building will undergo renovations from June to November 2022.)



6 Yokohama Three Towers **1** Half-day

In the early 1900s, the first thing sailors returning from overseas saw at the port were "Yokohama three towers", the Kanagawa Prefectural Government Main Building, the Yokohama Customs House and the Yokohama Port Opening Memorial Hall with its clock tower. They were nicknamed the King, Queen and Jack Tower, respectively.

2 Kishamichi Promenade **1** Half-day



This promenade, which crosses the sea using a section of the Rinkai Railway, was opened in 1911, and the rail and bridge are preserved to give you a feel of those days. It offers a view of Minato Mirai and is a popular cherry blossom spot.



3 Hammerhead Crane **1** Half-day

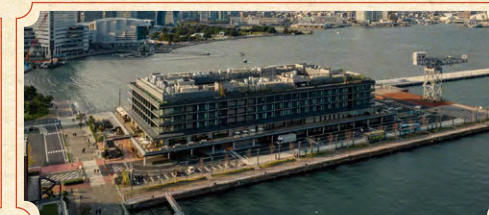
Certified as a Heritage of Industrial Modernization



The electric hoist at Shinko Pier was introduced from the UK in the 1910s. It has survived the Great Kanto Earthquake and is one of the tree cranes remaining in Japan since that time.

This is Japan's first permanent urban ropeway, which went into operation on April 22, 2021, along the Kishamichi Promenade. Travel while enjoying the scenery of Yokohama below.

JICA Yokohama (Japanese Overseas Migration Museum)

Many Japanese immigrated abroad from the Port of Yokohama. Visitors can enjoy the Japanese Overseas Migration Museum, which introduces the history of Japanese immigration, the JICA Plaza Yokohama, which introduces Japan's international cooperation, and the Port Terrace Cafe.

8 Yamashita Park



Yamashita Park is Japan's first seaside park, created in 1930 by landfilling rubble from the Great Kanto Earthquake. The statues remind us of international exchange, such as the Indian Water Tower and the Guardian God of Water presented by the city of San Diego. The view of the harbor is perfect for a date.

This dish started out as a version of pasta with a tomato ketchup that was eaten by soldiers of the Occupation Forces after the war.

Gyu Nabe (Beef Hot Pot)

In the late Edo period, Japanese saw foreigners in the area eating beef, so it was stewed with soy sauce and miso to make it more palatable.

Nationally Designated Important Cultural Property in 2016



Completed in the same year as the opening of Yamashita Park where the ship is permanently moored. She was a cargo-passenger liner that entered service on the Seattle across the Pacific Ocean and called the "Queen of the North Pacific" for her lavish decor, cuisine and top-notch services. During the Pacific War, the ship was used as a special naval hospital ship by the Japanese Imperial Navy.



COLUMN



Minato Mirai 21 District

This district was built by reclaiming the sea where a shipyard and Japan Railway yard once were. It was one of Yokohama's "Six Major Projects" announced in 1965, and urban functions and landscapes were created as a modern town connecting Kannai and Isezaki-cho, which have flourished since the opening of the port, and the Yokohama Station area, which was developed after the war.

SANKEIEN

Sankeien Garden is a Japanese garden designed by Sankei Hara in 1906, covering an area of 18 hectares. In the latter half of the 19th century, the Port of Yokohama, Japan's first international trading port and the main gateway to Japan, was the site of a thriving raw silk trade. Sankei Hara was one of the industrialists who made his greatest fortune in the manufacture and trade of raw silk. He also collected architecture and art, and supported artists. Some of these artworks are now housed in the Tokyo National Museum as national treasures. His splendid collection of classic architecture such as temple towers, elegant old homes, teahouses, and other buildings of unique style, was brought from Kyoto, Kamakura, and other regions of country. They are located skillfully in a way that fits in with the garden's excellence of nature as it changes through the four seasons.

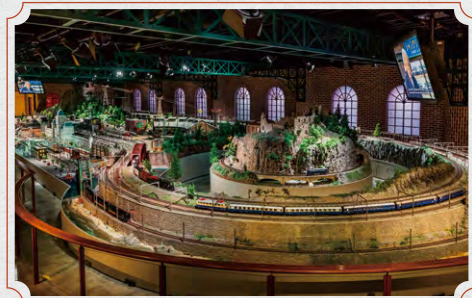

The main attraction is the "Ichiban Tetsumo Park", one of the largest 1-gauge indoor dioramas in the world. The sound and power of the models are truly breathtaking.

Keikyu Museum (Keikyu Group Headquarters)



Experience: Train simulation and diorama driving experience *Subject to fees
The concept of the museum is to "see, touch, and enjoy the real thing". Historical railroad cars from the early Showa era are on display, as well as a railway diorama that faithfully recreate scenes along the Keikyu railway line. You can also experience crafting, a driving experience and other activities.

S/PARK (Shiseido Global Innovation Center)



This facility where you can experience beauty and cosmetics was opened in April 2019 under the theme of "a place to encounter the inspiration of beauty" in Minato Mirai. 1st floor: A studio where you can experience Shiseido's research and try out their main cosmetic products. 2nd floor: An interactive museum where visitors can think about "beauty" and learn about their cutting-edge technologies.

S/PARK Cafe



A cafe where you can freely enjoy meals according to your daily mood and physical condition. The restaurant is based on the concept of "veggie-centric", which means being "vegetable-centric". The menu is prepared and developed by a chef who has gained experience at Shiseido Parlor.

The Yokohama Museum of Art, which features a powerful symmetrical exterior and an open-plan grand gallery in the atrium designed by architect Kenzo Tange, was opened on November 3, 1989. It is one of the largest art museums in Japan, with seven galleries, an art information center and an atelier where various workshops are held.

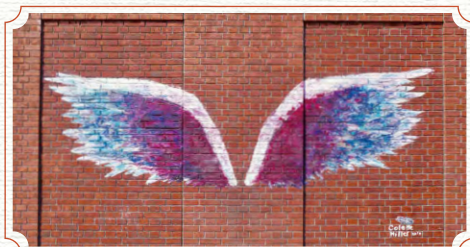

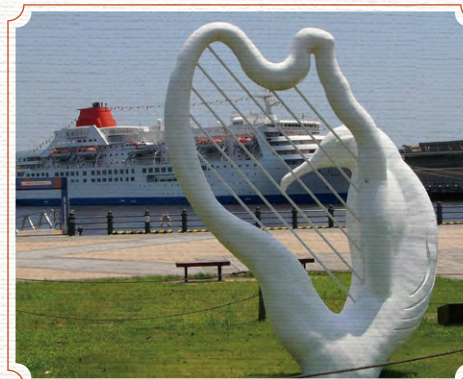


This is **Periko** at the Zou-no-hana Park. The actual size of the decorative object is about the same as a medium-size dog.

4 Statue of a goddess "Michibiki"

With an exterior that designed to evoke the image of a yacht under sail, this hotel is very eye-catching. If you look up at the top of the building from the ocean side, you can see the statue of the goddess "Michibiki", which is the origin of the name of the Megami (Goddess) -bashi Bridge. The statue is meant to "lead" and was installed as a hope that Yokohama would fly high and the safety of voyaging ships.

Garden Necklace Yokohama

It offers lots of flowers and greenery as a project to promote "Garden City Yokohama". The flowers that bloom seasonally from late March to early June disseminate the charm of Yokohama. During "Yokohama Rose Week" in May, you can enjoy walking around with roses along the harbor landscapes that let you feel the history of the port. In addition to the attractive garden events, this is a unique initiative in Yokohama where various parts of the city are connected like a necklace through encounters with flowers in partnership with restaurants in the area.



Creative illuminations

This is a light event held from mid-November to the end of December to let visitors enjoy the night in Yokohama and experience new attractions. Enjoy the unique Yokohama illuminations that beautifully light up the night at the Shiko Chuo Hiroba. This large monument was created in the image of "fluttering clouds" with an awareness of the path and flow of the wind. The artwork was intended to mitigate the strong "building winds" generated by the nearby tall buildings. At night, it is lit up and creates a dynamic space by illuminating the surrounding area.

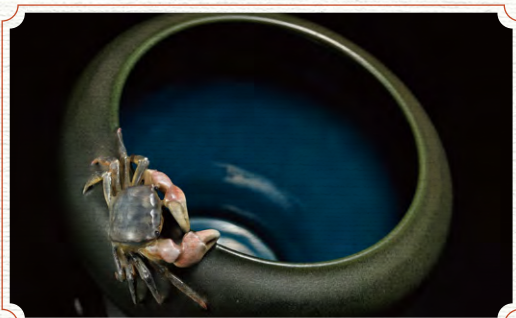

Yokohama, a city known for jazz



In the 1930s, eight years after the first live jazz concert was held in Yokohama, jazz cafes began opening up, transforming the city into a mecca for jazz music. Today, there are more than 40 jazz spots scattered throughout Yokohama, mainly in the Noge area. YOKOHAMA JAZZ PROMENADE, which started as part of a community revitalization initiative, has grown into one of the largest Jazz music events in Japan.

1 Noge

"The safest downtown in the world". An entertainment district with a nostalgic feel.

After the war, Noge was developed as an area of restoration and a black market town. Today, there are over 700 stores, and you can enjoy a variety of establishments, from old-fashioned stores to restaurants and bars. As a city of performing arts, "Noge Daido-gei", one of the three major street performances in Japan, and Yokohama Nigiwai-za, a facility specializing in rakugo (storytelling) and manzai (Japanese comedy), have passed on their traditions to the present.

2 Yamate

When the Port of Yokohama opened, Yamate was located on a cliff cut from the sea and was known as "The Bluff". Yokohama Harbor can be seen from Harbor View Park, where the international maritime flag from the film "From Up on Poppy Hill" flies to pray for safe navigation. On a clear day, you can take a walk through America Yama Park, Yamate Seiyokan, Yokohama Foreign General Cemetery and the churches to enjoy the views.

3 Motomachi

Eight years after the opening of the Port of Yokohama, the foreign settlement spread to the Yamate area, and Motomachi developed as a shopping area for foreigners living in Yamate. As a result, the area has development into a stylish, exotic and fashionable town.
